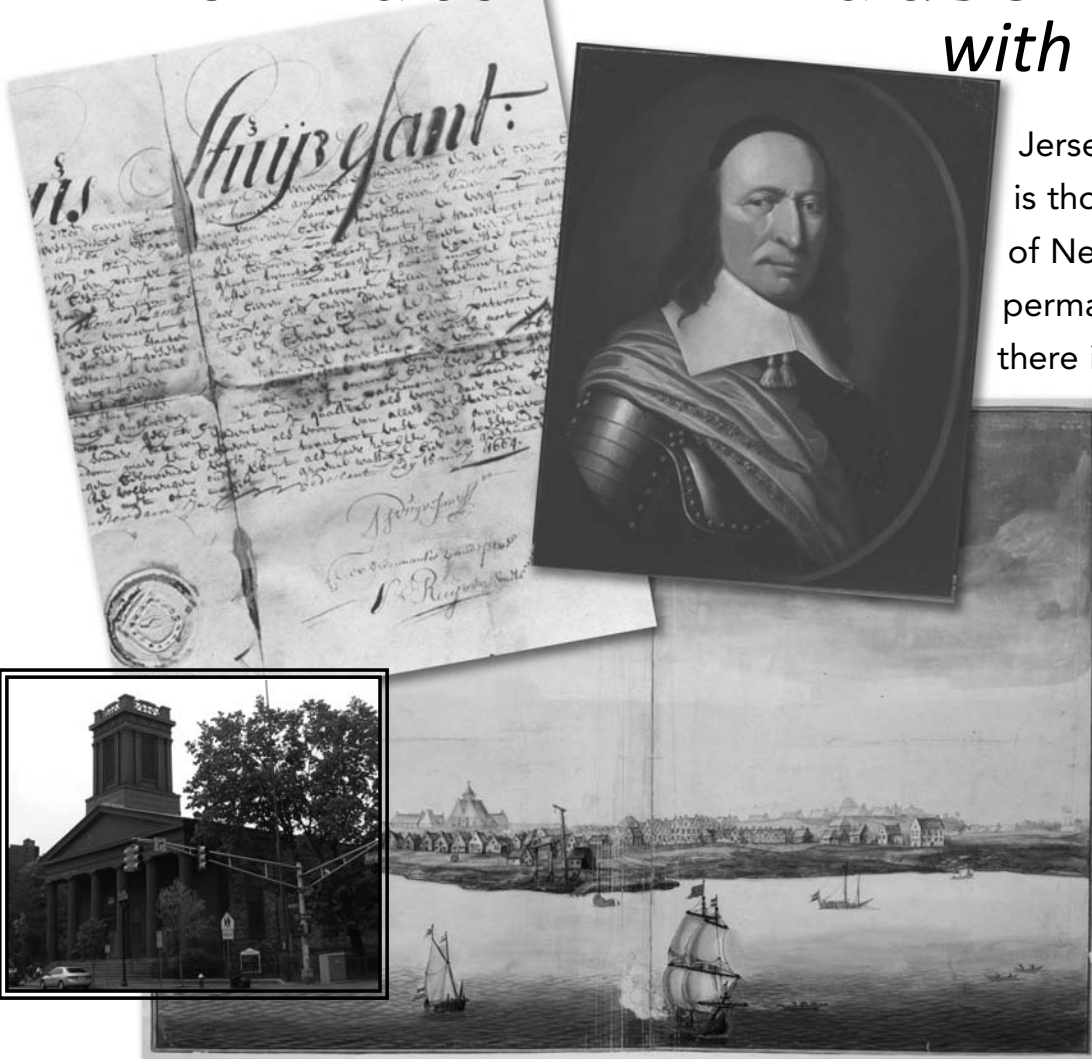


The Hudson County Genealogical Society presents:
